Submission:

I oppose the removal of Treaty of Waitangi clauses from legislation governing the ownership and management of state-owned enterprises.

I am Pakeha, but wish to express my opposition to proposals to remove Treaty of Waitangi requirements in any creation or amendment of legislation governing these assets. I support the opposition to these proposals by many tangata whenua.

I request that the Crown continue to honour the commitments made when the current legislation was written. It is not acceptable to now lay this aside for a short-term, short-sighted, one-off gain. The Treaty is not an optional extra. It must not be discarded when it is found to be inconvenient to the current Government's policy.

I request that the current legislation be retained, or, if this is not possible, that the current provisions are included in any new legislation.

I also wish to state my objection to the sale of state assets (either wholly or in part). While this may lie outside the current consultation document, it is the obvious reason for these proposals. I therefore wish my opposition to these proposed sales to also be recorded. I will forward, by separate email, a copy of the letter I have already sent to the Prime Minister on this subject, which expresses the grounds for my opposition.
